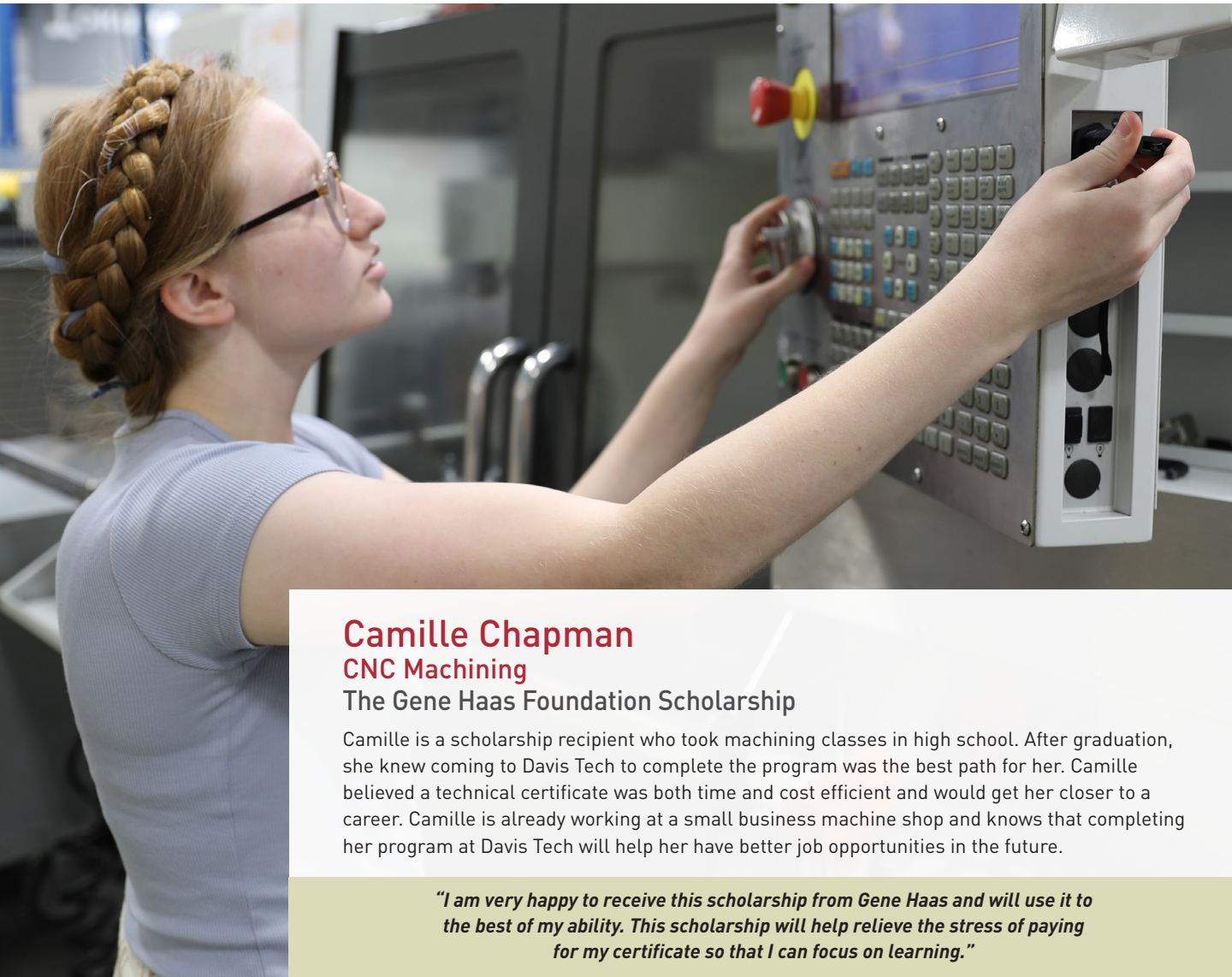

Student Resource Center

Recognizing there are many barriers to student success, the Foundation opened a Student Resource Center in February 2022. The Student Resource Center helps students access critical community resources, provides mental health support, and connects them to peer mentoring opportunities. The center also has a fully stocked student food pantry and grab-and-go meals for students who are experiencing hunger insecurity.

Since February, the Student Resource Center has provided critical food resources to nearly 100 students and has made dozens of referrals to community resources such as Head Start, Bountiful Food Pantry, and the Department of Workforce Services.
